<u>Program Vision</u>: An ambitious picture for the future of the academic program to be sophisticated, inspiring, stimulating, realistic and applicable.


<u>Program Mission:</u> Briefly outlines the objectives and activities necessary to achieve them and defines the program's development paths and directions.
