Parts of a Composition

- Introduction
- Presents the topic and engages the reader.
 Includes a thesis statement or the main idea.
- Body Paragraphs
- Each paragraph discusses one main point supporting the thesis. Use clear examples, details, and transitions.
- Conclusion
- Summarizes the main points, restates the thesis in a new way, and provides closure

General Basics in Writing a Composition

- Clarity: Make your ideas clear and understandable.
- Coherence: Ensure all parts of your composition are logically connected.
- Organization: Follow a clear structure (introduction, body, conclusion).
- Grammar & Style: Use correct grammar and an appropriate writing style.
- Editing: Always revise for errors and improve clarity.

Tips for Writing a Good Composition

- Plan before you write (brainstorm ideas).
- Use an outline to organize your points.
- Stick to the main topic.
- Be creative and original.
- Keep sentences varied in structure and length.
